Burklo will be moving in to the USSF Developmental Academy system, as he makes the move to Illinois to join the coaching staff at Scott Gallagher Illinois. Both branches are one of the few clubs that are part of both ECNL and the USSF Developmental Academy.

After an exhaustive and broad search Corinthians FC SA will be making an announcement on their 2015 coach next week with a contract with the new coach finalized.

Corinthians FC SA's new coach comes with vast experience, having played in the 2002 World Cup before going on to be on a coaching team in the 2010 World Cup. In addition to his World Cup experience the new manager has experience in both Spain's La Liga and Mexico's Liga MX. “We are beyond excited about hiring a coach with such an impressive resume. As our CFCSA progression continues we hope to continue to showcase the Mecca of soccer talent and potential within the San Antonio area.” The club will be making the announcement early next week.
